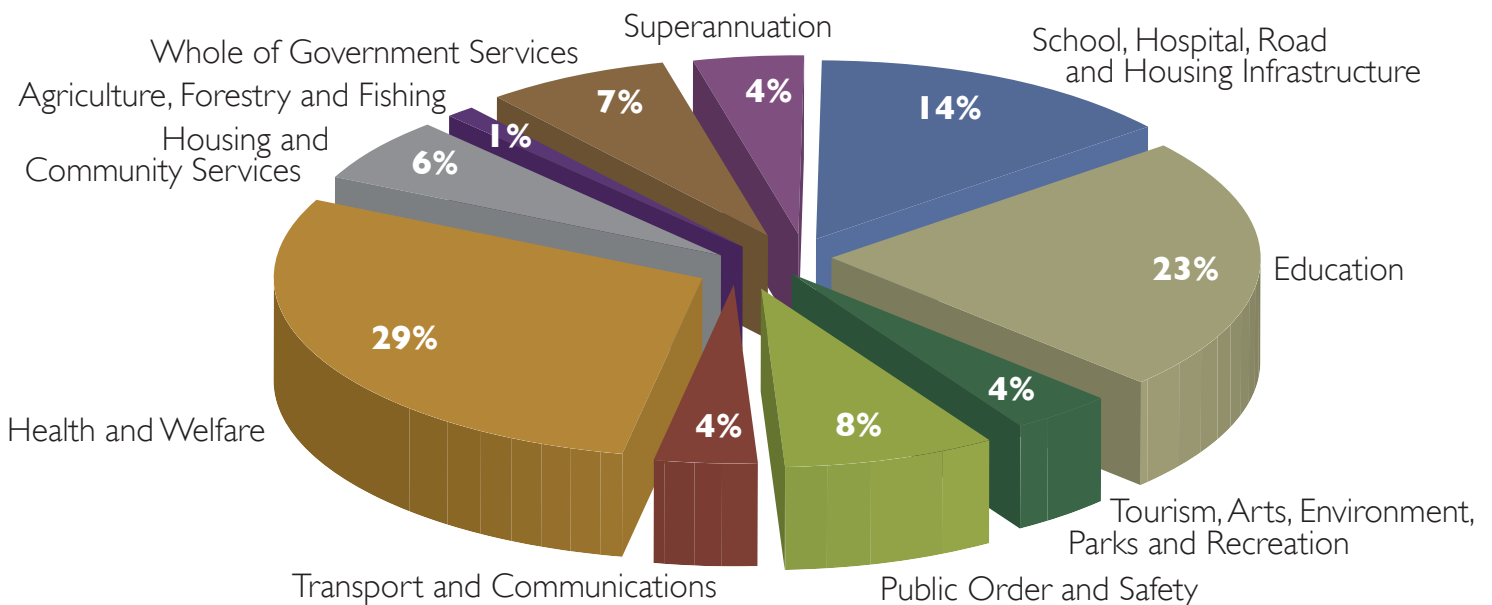


How the State Budget affects you

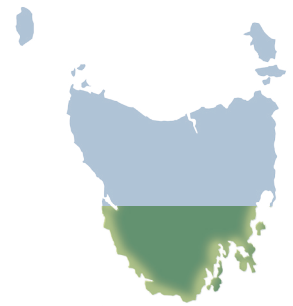
